II. MINUTES

1) Regarding PSE&G's request for a linear utility installation waiver, the SSCC cannot issue a waiver for 251 applications.

2) Projects needing a 251 approval due to damage from Hurricane Sandy will submit a flat fee of \$200.00 for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Plan Certification.

3) The SSCC will be responding to comments received for the Chapter 251 Rules and NJ Standards for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control.
